Results from last week

1st Grade - disappointing loss to an experienced Hamwicks team who bowled to the conditions with only Ryan van Kemenade reaching double figures. Ed Wharton with 3 early wickets gave city some hope however Hamilton/Wickham ran out convincing winners by 7 wickets.

2nd grade - lost outright to Hamilton with Liam Whitehead top scoring in both innings with scores of 25 and 41. Cal and Quinn Fowler both picked up 4 wickets a piece.

3rd grade - Last round saw four City legends, Rob Hungerford, Wayne Nichols, Craig Handy and Sammy Brentnall, come out of brief retirement, with all starring like they'd never stopped. Bowling first, City dismissed Hamwicks for 96, with Sammy taking 4 wickets, with 2 a piece to Wayne, Craig and Jordan Parker. Hungers led the way with the bat, cracking a quick 67, before a cameo of 32 from Jay Garrett, leading City to 168. City then rolled Hamwicks for 57, Mitch Gray taking 4-3, and 2 each to Jordan and Ryan Droop, as City gained outright points to keep their semi-final aspirations alive.

4th grade - The fighting 4s had a tense battle against top of the table Hamwicks at Hawkins Oval. Richard Tait and Troy Arnold came out of retirement after a desperate call to arms and took 4 and 2 wickets respectfully, with Jasmine Goode and Brad O'Dell also taking 2 apiece. A strong Hamwicks line-up managed 260 on week 1. In reply, City grafted their way to 1-60 before collapsing to 6-95. Some lusty hitting by Freemo kept City in the hunt before we were eventually dismissed for 175. Despite the loss, it was a solid effort against a very strong side.
